# The Rosary


The Rosary is both a prayer and a tool used to aid in prayer.

The exact origin of the Rosary is unclear, but the use of prayer beads and cords in prayer goes back nearly to the beginning of the church.

It is commonly believed that the Blessed Virgin Mary revealed to St. Dominic the way we should pray the Rosary as we know it today.

## How To Pray

- I. Make the sign of the cross and say the *Apostle's Creed*.
- 2. Say the Our Father.
- 3. Say three *Hail Marys* for Faith, Hope, and Charity.
- 4. Say the Glory Be.
- 5. Announce the first mystery and say the *Our Father*.
- 6. Say ten *Hail Marys*, one for each bead.
- 7. Say the Glory Be.
- 8. Announce the next mystery, say the *Our Father*, and repeat steps 6 8 until the Rosary is finished.
- 9. Say the *Hail Holy Queen* and finish with the sign of the Cross.
